2024 National Azul Poll

- Total N=2,500 Latino registered voters (+/-2.0%)
 - > Oversamples
 - N=200 per: Boston+NE, Chicago, Georgia, NC+SC, Pennsylvania, PAC NW, Texas
 - N=225 per: Florida, New Jersey+New York
 - N=300 California
 - N=350 All other US
- Field Dates: May 8-22, 2024
- English or Spanish, according to preference
- Mixed mode: 75% online, 25% live telephone interview














The Ocean As A Source Of Recreation And Identity




The Coast and Ocean As A Source Of Economic and Personal Vitality






Pollution in the Water, Air, and Ocean Strongly Concern The Latino Community

How concerned are you about the following issues?




Latino Support Ending Plastic Pollution and Illegal Fishing

How much do you support or oppose each of the following policy proposals?




Latino Conservationism Is Tied To Environmental Health Risk Perceptions

Offshore Drilling Threatens Community Health



Over half of Latinos regard offshore oil and natural gas drilling as a risk to the health and wellbeing of their community.

The Public Agrees That The Environment/Ocean Is In Crisis, Disagree with Inaction


Climate change is not a real emergency but part of a natural process of change








Regardless of Region, Latinos Support Azul's Ocean Justice Policy Goals: Ending Plastic Pollution





Increase Ocean Protections / Switching To Renewable Energy


Conserving 30 percent of land and ocean waters in the United States by the year 2030


Latinos Support Efforts to Combat Illegal Fishing, Even If It Means Paying More For Fish


