Latino voters recognize the urgency and impact of climate change: people's health, safety, and futures are on the line.

The 2026 National Azul Poll reveals overwhelming concern about environmental threats and sends an urgent message to decision-makers: we must act now to cut pollution, accelerate climate action, and protect our communities.

With a strong majority of Latino voters recognizing climate risks and affirming the government's duty to conserve our shared natural resources, leaders have a clear mandate for action.

They must turn public support into lasting protections and make decisions today that safeguard both present and future generations.

	Latino voters sound the alarm: Climate action cannot wait
82%	Agree that climate change is a serious problem that will affect people's lives, the same share that agrees that climate change poses a safety and health risk for people
94%	Say environmental issues such as pollution and global warming are personally important

	Latino voters call for government action to protect our future
80%	Say climate change will put beaches and other areas in or near the ocean at risk.
80%	Say a candidate who supports stronger policies to protect the coastline and ocean would make them more likely to vote for that candidate
86%	Say government has a responsibility to conserve land and ocean areas for the enjoyment of present and future generations

The 2026 Latinos and the Ocean: National Azul Poll gives decision-makers a crucial political roadmap: protect community health, hold polluters accountable, keep coasts accessible, accelerate the transition from fossil fuels, and safeguard our shared natural resources for future generations.
